With reference to your request for information received on 26th November 2024, I can confirm in accordance with Section 1 (1) of the Freedom of Information Act 2000 that we do hold the information you have requested. A response to each part of your request is provided below.

In your request you asked:

Could you provide answers to the below questions for each hospital in your trust, please?

- 1. How many doses of each of the following strengths of Meropenem do you administer annually?
 - **500mg** = 190.
 - **1 gram** = 5,045.
 - 2 grams = 301.

2. What are the main areas of your hospital where Meropenem is used?

Meropenem is used in all areas of the hospital, including community hospital at home teams, when needed to treat appropriately indicated infections.

3. What are the main conditions you use Meropenem to treat?

- Aerobic and anaerobic Gram-positive and Gram-negative infections
- · Hospital acquired septicaemia
- Exacerbations of chronic lower respiratory-tract infections in cystic fibrosis
- Meningitis
- Endocarditis

4. How do you currently administer Meropenem via bolus or infusion? If you infuse, do you use gravity or pump sets?

Short IV infusion. Normal practice is infusion via pump.

- 5. Where is your Meropenem currently reconstituted (e.g., wards or aseptic units)? Wards. The Trust doesn't have an aseptic unit.
- 6. Do you face any challenges when administering Meropenem?
- 7. Do you frequently experience drug shortages of Meropenem? No.
- 8. How many medication errors do you experience per month when administering Meropenem? There has only been 1 reported incident mentioning Meropenem in the 12 months from 09/12/2023 to 09/12/2024. This is 0.083 per month.
