- Direct Supervision is defined as "the registered nurse is physically present with the student on commencement and discontinuation of the procedure or if a significant change occurs to the treatment."
- Within child health students can only practice under the direct supervision of the registered nurse after the drug has been second checked with another registered nurse. The student will only observe the administration of Controlled Drugs and will not act as a second signatory for the administration of Controlled Drugs.
- 3. Intravenous therapy relates to saline, glucose, gelofusine, hartman's solution and saline and glucose <u>without</u> potassium already added. Connection of other solutions to patients is <u>NOT</u> permitted by student nurses
- 4. Mixing of intravenous drugs and antibiotics by student nurses is **NOT** permitted.
- Edge Hill and UCLan student nurses <u>Adult Branch Only are</u> permitted to be involved in the collection or checking of blood products Red cells, FFP, Platelets only. <u>Child Branch students may only observe.</u>
